



#### A Haven in the Desert

Water in the desert is an irresistible magnet

to life. Centuries ago, the Kumeyaay Indians were initially attracted to the springs at what we now call Agua Caliente ("hot water" in Spanish). Spanish explorer Juan Bautista de Anza was the first European to visit the area in 1775. In more recent times, the springs at



Agua Caliente were used by pioneers, soldiers, and prospectors.

The seismic activity that long ago shaped the Tierra Blanca Mountains (and created the spur of the Elsinore fault that runs beneath the park) also enabled water to come to the surface and form

the park's natural springs. A wide variety of wildlife is attracted to these springs, including ground squirrels, foxes, coyotes, and bobcats. The relatively abundant water supply also supports lush plant life, such as mesquite, willows, Washingtonia palms, and acacias. Depending on

the season's rainfall, wildflowers and succulents can put on a colorful show in early spring.
